Greetings Friends,

As we look back over the recent months there has been a great deal of activity, progress and success all mixed together.

In the spring, we had great concerns about the funding future of Head Start. But after a great deal of education and advocacy work, we are delighted that the current Administration sees the value of Head Start as the program continues to invest in our nation's future. Though, like every administration, we believe that this Administration's priorities will be advanced through changes to our program, and we are excited that after celebrating its 60th birthday, Head Start has a bright and healthy future!

After many years of work, we have finally begun construction to renovate our new administrative offices and transportation hub/shop at the Alton Plaza. It's located next to the Alton Police Department and where our Essic Robinson Head Start center has been for over 30 years. We hope that renovations and our move will be complete in October, so that we can get settled in just before the winter weather hits. We have been blessed with support from our funding source as well as the lease holders for our administrative offices and transportation hub being flexible with us as we navigate this change.

Next, through quality improvement funds received from our Illinois **Pre-School for All Expansion** grant, we are able to implement salary recommendations from our independently conducted salary survey ensuring that our employees are competitively compensated throughout the metro east. This will allow us to continue to stabilize our staffing and build the critical institutional knowledge that our legacy of quality services has been built upon.

Finally, we completed our monitoring cycle with a recommendation for a renewed five-year funding cycle to bring Head Start and Early Head Start to our community without having to compete for our grant. Many thanks to our volunteers, community, Board of Directors, families, staff and administration for working so well together to ensure that quality services and outcomes were the headline of our federal monitoring visit - ensuring access to our services for years to come.




Foust is just one of the unsung heroes in the IS Department, who take pride in the work they do in keeping their colleagues up and running efficiently.


"The best part of my job is making your job easier," says Foust. "Anytime I solve someone's problem, I feel good. I may not directly make a difference, but I make it easier for those who do."

Alton Plaza – 1848 E. Broadway, Alton, IL 62002




Happy Birthday Head Start!

The Head Start Project launched on May 18, 1965 as a comprehensive child development program. Over the last six decades, it has provided a window of opportunity to more than 40 million vulnerable children and their families. The program has provided better health, better preparation for kindergarten, and a greater likelihood of graduating high school and going on to post-secondary education.*

Head Start locations throughout the U.S. proudly celebrated Head Start's 60th birthday by spreading the word about the monumental impact the program is having on children and their families, as well as our communities and in neighborhoods throughout the U.S. For our part, Riverbend Head Start employees gathered during our Staff Appreciation picnic on Friday, May 23rd to wish the program a happy 60th birthday in grand fashion. We recorded a drone video with the entire staff saying "Happy Birthday Head Start" which was complete with noisemakers. "Getting to know each and every child on my bus and their families is the best," says Gray. "It's amazing, the connections that are made during a 2-to-5-minute exchange with families. Each child has a different personality that often times can come with incredible stories to share, and stuffed babies that I'm required to pet and talk to as well."

In addition to the children, Gray looks forward to seeing her colleagues every day.

"Granite City South has a great staff, they're very helpful and work with us to accomplish the fulfillment of the Riverbend mission," says Gray. "I also have the best Bus Monitor (Carla Frazier), that makes my job so much easier."

"Connie's excitement and commitment to her job everyday shows through her interactions with the kids and their parents," says Lead Family Advocate Paige Simmons. "Connie is so positive and welcoming to every child that walks through the door. She connects with all of them. She is such a positive light to coworkers and other staff, making sure to greet everyone and to see how they're doing. It's clear that she loves her job and appreciates the uniqueness of each child."

Even though she's got a sunny disposition, Gray says that one challenge that comes with the job is when the kids show up having a "rainy day" as she calls it.

"Sometimes, it's due to changes at home or difficulties at home which causes them to struggle with how to make good choices," she says. "Helping them navigate that while still fulfilling my number one responsibility can sometimes prove to be challenging. However, keeping the mission in mind helps me to remember why I'm here, but I hope they know that I see and hear them. I hope it helps, even if just a little bit."
